Hope from Ashes

Rose Williams is angry. Her neighborhood has been the site of repeated tragedies in recent months: a homeless shelter burned to the ground as fleeing residents were gunned down in a hate crime. A school-bus was driven through the streets, killing two and burning to the ground, again with reports of gunfire. Bodies of the victims of flood lung were found in the local dog park. But her anger now has an outlet.

"We are threatened and the police do nothing. Fire and death in the streets and the politicians do nothing. They want us to hide away and be quiet. We are to be the silent victims. No more! No more!", Williams spoke to an enthusiastic crowd of over two hundred at a rally Tuesday night.

The newly formed People Allied Against Intimidation is organizing a "Take Back the Night" effort, with an organized neighborhood watch and free classes in self defense. Patterned after similar organizations elsewhere in the country, the group has procured space and equipment to educate people about ways to improve the neighborhood by being observant and able to protect themselves and others.

Although primarily centered in East Nashville, fliers and door to door fundraising have been reported in neighborhoods around the city. Seventeen and nineteen year old Kaylee and Avery Wins were going door to door in Green Hills. The sisters said that they were prompted to become active in the organization due to stories shared on Facebook. "We were reading stuff, and it was pretty tragic", said Avery, "so we figured we should help out in any way we can."

Kaylee also noted that it would help with her college applications in the coming school year.

Drought Worsens

Record heat coupled with low rainfall has prompted municipalities in the state to begin voluntary or mandatory water use restrictions. Percy Priest Lake is at record lows: the public is being asked to conserve water to avoid mandatory restrictions.

Local agriculture has been hit unexpectedly hard, with crops that were flourishing earlier in the year wilting under the steady sun. Tennessee State Ag Extension representative Carl Ivanov said that it was a notable event.

"While drought certainly affects crops, sunshine itself is generally seen to promote growth. We've been tracking the unexpected crop failures and are looking for a cause", Ivanov said.

While Sonia Harvat, spokeswoman for Metro Water Services, has declared Nashville under a "Drought Alert", water usage remains low enough to avoid a mandatory restriction. Rainfall this weekend is expected to help alleviate the problem, and a prediction of heavy rainfall during the fall should replenish reserves.

Violence at the Frist Center

Gang violence erupted in the heart of downtown Nashville's cultural attractions on Saturday, June 16th. Although reports of the two events had been released, law enforcement confirmed that the cause was an initial shooting followed shortly by a drive by retaliation.

"The Frist and Union Station are icons of our city, but they stand at an uncomfortable junction with neighborhoods that are historically under-served by the city resources available to more affluent areas", said Josiah Markelson, candidate for State Senate. "As a friend remarked recently, we have to view the health of the city as a whole as a priority and move to grow in a manner that is thoughtful and planned."

Lots of ghouls around. People are still freaked out about the vampire killers. People are taking self defense and safety courses. *It is getting downright **hard** to feed in this town.*

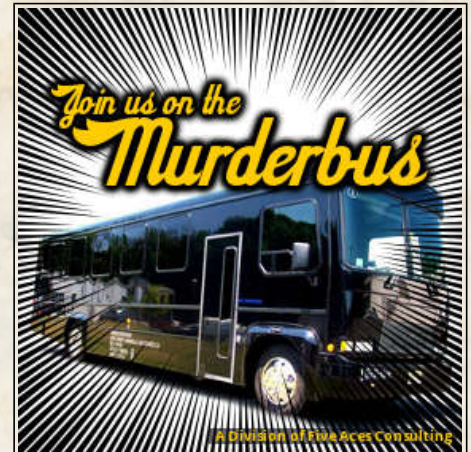
