Bullsworth Legacy was Crime

Over the last several months, an unprecedented rise in crime in East Nashville was accompanied by the rise of a series of non-profit groups dedicated to justice and charity in the less affluent neighborhoods that were affected.

Prominent among those groups was the Bullsworth Foundation, a group formed by his congregation after the Reverent Bullsworth and his daughter were declared missing. The group operated six homeless shelters and churches throughout East Nashville, and their contributions to the local neighborhood watch was considered invaluable.

The group is painted with a different brush today, as law enforcement and code enforcement deals with the final shut-downs of the shelters and churches.

“Not only was there alleged to be a tremendous amount of criminal activity occurring within this group, but code enforcement had been attempting to shut down one of their locations for months. Now that we are doing inspections, it looks like they are all going to have to be shut down”, said Lt. Robert Pike, of the Nashville Metro Police Department.

Earlier this year a code inspector had reported standing water and visible black mold in the basement of one of the shelters. At that time there was no allegations of criminal activity, however that information came from a health related source as well.

Specialists from the Centers for Disease Control answered a plea from the Mayor for help and engaged in a new method of treating crime as a disease. They assisted local law enforcement in finding the connection between the Bullsworth Foundation and the rise in crime. In addition, they have assisted code enforcement in the testing and evaluation of the standing water and mold that was found in the basements of the shelters.
